Dear friends

It gives me great pleasure to write to you with the final edition of our newsletter for the year 2022. We have had a very busy end of the year, with several events, activities and reports marking our calendar. As part of our work towards safe nutrition, we continue asking for warning labels on the front of processed foods. The recent draft regulations passed by the FSSAI propose star ratings; but we continue putting across the need for warning labels, especially given the soaring rates of non-communicable diseases and death in our country. Towards this, we have organised events with stakeholders and made representations to the government.

Our work towards safe and sustainable roads has had exceptional outcomes as recently the Tamilnadu government began enforcing the fines recommended by the MVAA 2019. This has been one of our many requests over the years. We commend the State Government for this important move. We continue working with our partners to push for policies that prioritise the needs and safety of vulnerable road users. The World Day of Remembrance for Road Accident Victims (19th November) was marked with events in Thiruvarur, Tirunelveli and Chennai. The event in Chennai was presided over by Thiru Shankar Jiwal, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Chennai.

We continue to work towards sustainability in several ways - we recently added online stores to our Zero Waste Shop Locator, and have created an app for assessing the energy efficiency of a household. The last of our Climate Change 101 videos was released last month - and well received by the public. In January, two important pieces of work that we've been working on will be released - CAG's plastic brand audit report and the Climate Change school curriculum. The pilot project for the curriculum will be deployed in two city schools just after Pongal. We have participated in / closely followed the COP 27 and the Global Plastics Treaty. Both these international events have much relevance to our sustainability targets.

In this edition of the newsletter, we bring to you articles, reports, podcasts and videos, from all areas of our work. We hope you enjoy perusing through this and getting to know us and our work a bit better. If you would like any more information, please feel free to get in touch with us.
