Dear friends

I am pleased to write to you this second quarter with all our exciting news. Firstly, Climate Action Month (CAM) 2025 is running right now! Make sure that you are a part of it, as activities continue across the city of Chennai, over July. If all the news about climate change worries you, CAM changes the focus from anxiety to action. Be a part of this exercise in solidarity and collective action.

Our many projects on energy governance and conservation have carried into this year. We have particularly been working to increase solar energy uptake in Tamil Nadu, via the installation of rooftop solar panels. This has included workshops and campaigns across Chennai, together with information dissemination via printed material and social media. We've also continued to build on the success of our energy audits, expanding our efforts to include apartment complexes and government buildings. With Chennai's rising temperatures and increasing air conditioning use across the country, energy conservation has become more urgent than ever. However, for many low-income households without access to ACs, coping with the heat is a serious challenge. Our Cool Roof project addressed this by combining climate action with practical technology to help vulnerable families achieve thermal comfort. The project evaluated several cost-effective Cool Roof solutions that could achieve high impact with minimal investment.

Our work in the area of environmental conservation took the form of a project on wetland conservation commissioned by the State government. We analysed the effectiveness of different strategies that could be used to empower local communities to preserve their environmental assets. The report will inform further work by the government, as they seek to harness community participation in protecting the commons.

While local communities play a vital role in protecting the environment, our work also engages policymakers across multiple focus areas. Recently, we conducted a study to understand the environmental attitudes of Members of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly. The study reveals both encouraging findings and critical gaps, underscoring the need for more effort in information dissemination across all stakeholders.

Our work on road safety continues with a strong push for key amendments to the Motor Vehicles Act—changes that hold the potential to save thousands of lives. While policy reform is vital, translating these changes into real-world impact remains central to our mission. This quarter, we conducted detailed road safety audits around select city schools, with findings set to be released soon. By bridging policy and ground-level action, we aim to make our cities safer and more accessible for all—especially our most vulnerable road users.


